2	To ensure all medical emergency equipment is checked and placed pitch side.		
3	To implement required first aid/acute injury management during training & fixtures.		
4	To assess and treat any injuries during sessions ensuring an evidence-based rehabilitation plan is in place for each injured player.		
5	To communicate player injuries, treatment details and follow up plan to the players parents if U18 and the coaching team.		
6	To complete any medical notes inline with the Foundations incident reporting system within 24 hours.		
7	Ensure compliance with all relevant legal, regulatory, ethical and social requirements at all times		
8	Maintain a professional image and act as an ambassador for WWF & WWFC at all times		
9	Keep confidential any information gained regarding the Charity, Club and its personnel
